Hello again. It is beetle season as soon as the lilies poke their noses above ground and I had beetle reports before my lilies were observed. At the present time I have all the plants from the back yard potted and ready to move. I have cleaned the front yard and have started looking for late comers to appear.

Some of my lilies have been planted way too long and will probably enjoy new soil and location. Especially the ones in the front yard who have to compete with a large thirsty birch tree.

Beetle wise I found a couple eager pests May 5. Then 9 on May 16. I sprayed with Dr Doom. Then on May 27 and 28 one each day. On the same lily! [it was Purple Life] Well all my potted lilies got sprayed again. I am definitely NOT transporting the little devils to B.C.

LILY SPOTLIGHT- DEVON DOTS

DEVON DOTS Unknown Parentage H: Devonian Botanical Gardens G:, N:(1975) & I:(1975): R. Erskine REG:1996. Rich



pink inside, with a pinky white throat and dark purple to near black spots distributed over most of each petal; outside pink; nectary's pink; pollen pinkish yellow. Flowers 80mm wide; petals 40 x 15mm, not ruffled, tips slightly recurved. Leaves whorled, 160 x 45mm, mid green. Stems 1.5m, brownish green, with up to 30 flowers. Early. RHS Supplement 15 LR entry lavender pink flowers with conspicuous dark line shaped spots # 6900 / a sister plant to Carolyn Rallison, Flowers are larger and less recurved. It won first prize, the year Bob took it to the Lily Show in Edmonton. Seed came from Devon Botanical Gardens

Master Gardener

The lily hybridized by Fred Fellner around 1986 was selected as the official selection for the Master Gardener Conference to be named and registered 'Master Gardener' in 1995. A stunning yellow-orange out-facing lily with greyred tips. It has dark red spots and green nectary with greyed purple stamens. SHOWING TIPS FOR THE BEGINNER

- Try to have your best stems to show.
- Aim to have as many open blooms as possible without having any faded blooms
- Flowers should be fresh clean and undamaged with no distortions such as leaning or bent stalks. Cut the stem length to two-thirds of height leaving one third in the garden.
- No disease should be apparent.
- Leave the pollen anthers on. Clean off all pollen on petals.
- Clean all debris and critters off of stems.
- The beginner has as much chance of winning a ribbon as the experienced show entrant. We have Junior sections too.
- ARLS has members and classification judges available during entry hours to help. We love to have new entrants to our shows. Come and have fun.
- Stem holders are available, just carefully pack up your stems in buckets, and bring them in.
- Details on entering the show are in the show schedules. See website for a schedule.
- For specific details the Judging and Showing Handbook published by the North American Lily Society is available for purchase.
- Design section is a creative floral arrangement. Anybody interested in floral arranging can enter a design.
- The Annual Shows are well attended by the public and you do not have to be an ARLS member to enter a stem or design. Come have fun.

The design section usually has pre-registration on the classes as there is a limit on entries for each class. Please check the ARLS Website and Facebook for the schedules so you can reserve your spot. The design section is judged by a floral professional designer. One of the designs at the 2019 show that won a first place is below. Find out the classes available- we change the show design theme every year. Sometimes there is extra material at the show to use for your designs so you can make them up at home or come and be creative on site.

Sunday at take down we expect you to collect your design and take home your ribbons.
